Becoming a Member

ADA has a range of membership types available to risk management authorities and other bodies with responsibilities and powers to manage land drainage, water levels and flood risk. In addition, suppliers of equipment and expertise to the sector can become associate members and interested members of the public may become individual members of ADA.

Membership types

Local Authority

District, Borough, County and Unitary Councils all play a key role in managing flood risk and can become members of ADA.

Annual Subscription 2018: £327+VAT

National Agency

All of the national agencies with a strategic overview for managing flood risk in England, Wales and Northern Ireland are members of ADA, helping them make connections with local delivery partners. This includes the Environment Agency, Natural Resources Wales and Dfl Rivers. Other public authorities, including water companies, may also join ADA in this category.

Annual Subscription 2018: £654+VAT

Internal Drainage Board (IDB)

IDBs are independent public bodies responsible for water level management in low lying areas. They work in partnership with others to actively manage and reduce the risk of flooding. ADA is recognised as the national representative body for IDBs.

Annual Subscription 2018: From £542+VAT, varies depending on size, contact the ADA office.

Associate (Business) Member

Associate membership is available to those who supply equipment, skills and services to the land drainage, water level and flood risk management industry.

Annual Subscription 2018: £395+VAT

Individual Member

Individual membership is available to anyone who is interested in water level management and the work of ADA and its members, and is unassociated with a business or public authority that is entitled to ADA membership.

Regional Flood & Coastal Committee (RFCC)

RFCCs provide a link between flood risk management authorities and other relevant bodies to develop mutual understanding of risks in their regions. They are made up of members appointed by lead local flood authorities and the Environment Agency, with a chair appointed by the Secretary of State.
