Andrew McLachlan, Flood Risk Strategy Manager for ERYC gave a presentation on ERYC Local Flood Risk Management Strategy. The team support and co-ordinate the ways in which the Council reduces and manages the risk of flooding within the East Riding working with its partners such as the Environment Agency, Internal Drainage Boards and Water Companies. With the support of elected members, Local MP's and major business', the Humber Local Authorities along with the Humber Local Enterprise Partnership have submitted a proposal to Government seeking a commitment for a single settlement of £1.28 billion required to improve estuary wide flood defences along the Humber Estuary.

lan updated members on the position of PSCA's it has prepared to be a good tool for partnership working between the Environment Agency and Internal Drainage Boards.

Richard Gwilliam National Grid

The application for the proposed carbon capture and storage (CCS) pipeline will be submitted on 18 June, 2014 and the decision to accept the application to proceed will be made in accordance with section 55 of the Planning Act 2008 (as amended by the Localism Act 2011).

The Yorkshire and Humber CCS Cross Country Pipeline will comprise the construction of approximately a 75km onshore pipeline and associated infrastructure for the transportation of carbon dioxide. The pipeline will be routed from the proposed White Rose CCS Project (Drax, North Yorkshire) via a proposed multi-junction at Camblesforth (North Yorkshire) to a land fall point near Barmston (East Riding of Yorkshire). The application will include associated infrastructure comprising pipeline internal gauge (PIG) traps, a multi-junction, three block valves, a pumping station and associated works.
