Schedule 3 of the Flood & Water Management Act 2010 *Statutory SuDS*

Schedule 3 was implemented on the 7th January 2019 and requires sustainable drainage on all construction work which has drainage implications for development over 100sq m.

Construction area means anything done by of way of, in connection with or in preparation for the creation of a building or other structure, which will affect the ability of the land to 'absorb' rainwater.

Ignore the word 'absorb' – it's an area of over 100sq m within a development area, where the run-off change <u>exacerbates flood risk</u>.



What is a SAB & what does it do?


A **SuDS Approval Body** (SAB) is the statutory body responsible for evaluating and approving applications. This process is separate to but runs parallel with the planning process.

Surface water systems on new development must be designed and constructed in accordance with the mandatory standards for sustainable drainage published by Welsh Ministers. Construction must not commence until the relevant consent has been received from the SAB and the relevant conditions discharged.

Welsh SuDS Review : improving delivery

- The Minister for Climate Change will be making a statement on the prioritisation of recommendations, based on a short, medium & long term delivery strategy.
- A new SuDS Community of Practice (SuDS COP) is starting next month including representatives from across the sector, which will aid in the delivery of the recommendations.
